## Newport Bridge opening off for '68

The ironworkers strike and bad weather have moved the opening of The Newport Bridge to spring of 1969 from the present December 31, 1968, completion date, it was announced recently by Francis G. Dwyer, Chairman of the Rhode Island Turnpike and Bridge Authority.

Specifically, Mr. Dwyer said, the causes for the completion date revision are:

...The continuing strike between the New England Steel Erectors Association and the International Association of Bridge, Structural and Ornamental Workers which has prevented any progress on the deck contract since July 1. Only the deck work is affected by the dispute.

-Seventeen days of rainy or windy weather during the month of June, which prevented all contractors from working on the span.

Mr. Dwyer announced that it is impossible to schedule a new completion date at the present time because it is not known when the ironworkers' strike will be over. Before a new date is set, the number of working days in the fall will have to be determined, he noted.
